

Cornell versus Boston University RED HOT HOCKEY

Madison Square Garden November 28, 2015 **Tie Score: 3:3**



It was tense! The Big Red Band was uncharacteristically silent. The game at the end of regulation play was tied, the Big Red having led until the third period, when Boston University, the traditional opponent for Red Hot Hockey the Saturday after Thanksgiving, evened the score. Fifty-one of us, including classmates, spouses, grown children—several of whom are also Cornellians—other family members, and friends, sat together in our Class of '64 block cheering on the Big Red. Three shootouts did not yield a winner until, finally, in an unusual sudden death shoot-out, BU prevailed.

The game was officially recorded as a tie. The sudden death round had been added, after an agonizing delay, because there was a magnificent trophy for this annual event that had to be presented. Unfortunately, the wrong team skated off with it. One of our prospective Cornellians (11 years old) sobbed inconsolably at this sight!

Despite the score, it was a wonderful evening spent with classmates and their families, beginning with a gathering at Pennsylvania 6, a festive restaurant just steps from MSG. We were a group of 42 in a private loft. The buffet dinner was delicious and plentiful, the company was terrific, the red and white flowers beautiful, and the giant class banner fun to see, but the noise was intense. One of us, a Brit, wore gigantic earplugs! The bar area below was screening the USC/UCLA Pack 12 championship game, and we learned later that night that Penn6 is "a USC bar."

The Class of 1964 John F. Kennedy Memorial Award

2015 marked the first JFK Award competition of our post-50th Reunion years and the first managed by Cornell's Pubic Service Center. PSC is a good match for us, as it offers one-stop shopping for students seeking all kinds of service opportunities on and off campus. The Center's large database of students, faculty and service-related programs enables us to reach a well-targeted pool of potential candidates for the JFK Award.

The 2015 winner, our 60th, was **Hannah McKinney**, an American Studies major in the College of Arts and Sciences. Hannah's chosen field is criminal justice, in particular, prison reform. Her own words, reflecting on her volunteer work in prisons, tell it best: "I realized," she wrote in her application, "that the system continues to punish long after the sentence ends." Hannah plans a career in human rights advocacy, focusing on reducing the prison population, eliminating the death penalty, and addressing the racial and structural biases in the criminal justice system. She is already well on her way, having volunteered at Prisoner Legal Services and Opportunities, Alternatives and Resources in Ithaca and at the Auburn Correctional Center; working at Advocates for Human Rights in Minneapolis, interning at the ACLU, volunteering with a daycare center in Ecuador, and learning about non-profit work during her Cornell in Washington semester, along with many other on-campus undertakings. Hannah received a fellowship to support her work with Advocates for Human Rights and won the Class of 2015 Award for Outstanding Achievement.

Since graduation, Hannah has been living and working in Boston, supporting herself by working at a small technology firm while putting out feelers for more research-based public policy jobs. She hopes to apply to the Harvard Kennedy School.

One of Hannah's referees wrote that "Hannah has already proven herself to be a young trailblazer in a domain of public service that too rarely attracts younger people with public service commitments." The Class of 1964 warmly welcomes Hannah McKinney as the latest winner of the JFK Memorial Award.

Derek Chollet, JFK '93, is Counselor and Senior Advisor for Security and Defense Policy at the German Marshall Fund. He was previously Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs, and a White House and State Department official. He is the author of six books.

Competition for the 2016 Award is under way and will be decided by early May. Look for news on the web page. Our winner will again be honored at PSC's annual year-end awards dinner. The award level remains at \$12,000.

This year's review committee is again composed of a mix of classmates and award alumni: Judie Pink Gorra, Tim Davis and Cindy Wolloch for the class, and Jared Genser, JFK '95 and Katie Dealy, JFK 2000, for the awardees. Besides offering cogent perspectives on the candidates and the process, Jared and Katie have been helpful in other ways – Jared, for talent-spotting and hiring our 2014 winner, Sam Ritholtz, to work with him on high-profile human rights cases; and Katie for guiding us on improving the application instrument and test-driving PSC's new and much improved version. We happily acknowledge the contributions of all committee members, past and present, for their dedication and good work.


