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Owner Plans Opening Day For Zinck's

Zinck's is not dead.

But the old tradition of "meeting down at Zinck's" will have to be resumed on the other side of S. Aurora St. Zinck's has moved from its long residence at 109 S. Aurora St. to the former location of Saunder's Food Market.

Although the move has been accompanied by slight modernization, the traditions which made Zinck's remain.

The walls of the new restaurant are covered with cherry and walnut panelling and red brick. Other new items include a sound-proof ceiling and walnut bar.

But the atmosphere of the old Zinck's has also made the journey across S. Aurora St. The ancient square tables in which innumerable names and initials have been carved, colorful fraternity plaques, lighting fixtures and wrought iron and artificial candles are all part of the new Zinck's. Even the familiar neon sign and the yellow and green Zinck's sign have been moved.

Zinck's will reopen at its new location Sept. 21 or 22, according to its owner Peter Hadzicki. Hadzicki, who has owned the restaurant for the past five years, explained that he had decided to move after a dispute over the

lease. Zinck's was originally established by Theodore Zinck in 1883.

Traditionally Zinck's, a fraternity meeting-place, has barred first-term freshman men. This policy will be continued, according to Hadzicki.

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
