No U.S. Troops for Viet Nam

Saigon, South Viet Nam (AP) — Informed sources said Sunday both the United States and South Viet Nam now seem agreed that the time is not ripe to bring U.S. troops to this Communist-menaced nation.

They made the observation in commenting on the special U.S. mission headed by Gen. Maxwell B. Taylor, which arrives this week to study the situation. They reported an air of pessimism persists in Saigon over the fight with the Viet Cong, the Communist rebels, but expressed doubt if the gloom is justified.

While no spectacular rebel raids were reported the past week, government announcements indicated all was not running smoothly.
