Sophomores Print Newspaper

The first issue of the Cornell Bear, a student newspaper subsidized entirely by the Sophomore Council, is available in the Willard Straight lobby today.

According to Kenneth R. Kupchak '64, editor-in-chief of the Bear, the purpose of the publication is to unify and inform the members of the Sophomore class. The newspaper aims to make the sophomores aware of the activities

initiated by their council, and of the contributions made by members of the class to the University as a whole.

At present, the Cornell Bear is the only class publication at the University. However, the staff of the Bear is now engaged in helping the Freshmen begin their own class newspaper.

This issue of the Bear contains articles about the contributions of sophomores to the varsity football team, and about Stephen M. Machooka '64, star member of the varsity cross country team.

Copies of the Cornell Bear have already been distributed to sophomores in fraternities and to sophomores in the womens' dormitories.
