Spring Party To Feature Twist Star

Chubby Checker will appear at the Friday night dance of Spring Weekend, it was reported last night by the Spring Weekend Committee. The report was one of several presented to the Executive Board at its weekly closed meeting.

A preliminary report on the progress of the Committee on the Study Period (formerly called Assimilation Period) was also heard. The Committee has conducted an extensive survey of students and faculty to measure opinion for and against a study period prior to final examinations.

The proposed study period would be five days in the fall term and four days in the spring term. Classes would end at 4 p.m. on the Wednesday preceeding the examination week. Sentiment on all sides seems to be favorable to the proposal.

Although many students indicated apprehension as to whether such a period would work, most were in favor of it. It was reported by the committee heads that important faculty members in all colleges were also in favor of the proposal.

The report of the committee will be studied in detail at tonight's open meeting of the Executive Board in the Willard Straight North Room.

The Board

Board approved the proposed curfew hours for IFC Weekend. They will be the same as last year — 1 a.m. Friday night and 3 a.m. Saturday night.

Extension of the hours during which women will be permitted in upperclassmen's rooms during IFC Weekend was also approved. Women will be permitted in upperclassmen's rooms until 12:30 a.m. Friday night and 2:30 a.m. Saturday night. Each represents a half-hour extension over last year.
