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### WSGA Bans Casual Wear While Dining

A proposal to let women wear slacks and bermuda shorts to breakfast and lunch in dormitory dining halls was defeated by WSGA last night. The assembly voted 15-5 in favor of keeping the rules on dress as they now stand.

Prior to the vote the results of a recently taken poll were announced. There were 729 girls opposed to the change, 613 for the change and 57 abstentions. It appeared that sorority women were overwhelmingly against the change while the dormitory vote was more evenly split. Many girls in the dorms could not be contacted for their opinion. It was noted that if there is interest in the fall, the matter can be brought up again.

Marcia Smith '62 reported on revisions of WSGA rules. A coed may now sign out to private residences in the Ithaca area with the permission of her head resident. She may not sign out to an unmarried man's apartment.

A problem brought about by the new rule of no senior curfew is whether guests of senior women should have the same privilege. It was decided that a guest is subject to the same rules as her hostess if her hostess takes full responsibility for her. If a boy asks a senior woman to put up his date, she does not have to accept

the responsibility. In this case he must take the responsibility and the guest must abide by regular dormitory closing hours. When the hostess does accept responsibility, she and her guest must come into the dorms at the same time.

It was announced that the program chairman for next year will be: Ronay Arlt '64, Comstock A; Susan E. Braterman '64, Balch III and IV; Beth L. Goldberg '64, Rislely; Jane F. Grundstein '64, Comstock B. Interviews for positions in Balch I and II and Donlon will be held today.

The dormitory presidents agreed to put boxes in the dorms to help Pi Lambda Theta collect books for the University of the Philippines.

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
